OBJECTIVES

- Discuss the multi-disciplinary management of acute low back pain, including medical, interventional, psychological, and rehabilitative approaches.
- Articulate legal perspectives on return-to-work challenges for the injured worker.

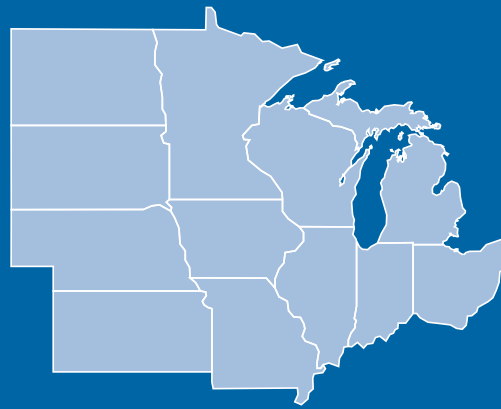
